Can I send my camper mail?

Yes, getting mail at camp just adds to the fun. But we ask, No food or drinks be sent. Mail can be sent to:

Can I call and talk to my camper during the week?

No, phone calls more often lead to a camper becoming homesick. If there are any problems the camp staff will contact you.

What clothes should my camper wear?

Clothes that can get messy and dirty are best. No low cut-shirts or low-side-cut cutoffs, stomach covered. Girls' bathing suits should cover the stomach, and boys need shorts style swimsuits. Shoes need to have a heel or heel strap.

How do I send medications to camp?

Send medication to camp in the original prescription bottle with the child's name and doctor's name or in the original over-the-counter medication bottle. All medication, even over-the-counter products, must be turned in to camp staff during check-in. Children are not allowed to keep medication with them at camp.

What does a typical day at camp look like?

While every day is a little bit different, we have some common elements each day. We start with breakfast, then chapel in the woods. Campers will then begin activities for most of the morning, followed by lunch, devotional time, more activities, and dinner. The evenings are all a little different and will create some wonderful stories for your camper to share with you.

What if my camper gets homesick?

Camp is a great place for campers to gain confidence and independence in a safe environment, and homesickness is sometimes a part of this growing process. Our staff are trained in dealing with homesickness and work to keep every camper excited and involved.
